Shelter for families. Some longer term housing available for shelter clients. Call to do intake with a case manager. Waiting list varies, but is usually 2-3 months.

Temporary shelter (up to 2 weeks at a time) for teens (age 12-17) who need respite from their homes, or runaway or homeless youth.

Housing Initiatives

Permanent community based housing for homeless people with severe mental illness who are unable to live on their own without supportive services. Must have referral from case manager. Waiting list is long.

Subsidized Housing

Some housing is available to people who have minor children, who are disabled or who are over the age of 62. Contact the Housing Help Desk with questions or for applications (608-242-7406).

Other Housing Solutions

YWCA

- Third Street: For single mothers

With one child, age birth – 4 years old.

1 BR: \$339/mo, 2 BR: \$386/mo.

- Rapid Rehousing: For homeless families with some income. Must be referred by a shelter case manager from Salvation Army, The Road Home or DAIS
- Housability: For homeless families with at least 1 disabled adult. Permanent housing. Must be referred by a case manager.

Seton House

Transitional housing program in apartment-like setting for homeless women with young children. Must have steady source of income.

Tellurian: SOS Program

For homeless families. Two year transitional housing program. 2-3 BRs, 30% of income charged, no income required.
