ARC

- ARC-Dayton St. (608-241-7616): A 3 mo. residential program for female offenders (previously incarcerated or paroled). Must be referred by P.O.
- ARC Maternal & Infant program (608-223-9033): for adult pregnant female offenders. 6 mo. program. Women must be referred by P.O. or be in ARC's other non-residential programs.
- ARC House (608-283-6430): For women with criminal conviction and diagnosed substance abuse problem. A four month AODA* residential program.

A 9-month residential program for women ages 18-29 pregnant with their first child.

Transitional housing program for homeless unaccompanied women. Must have steady source of income.

Low-cost temporary housing.

Programs for single women include:

- Spring St.: for eligible single Veterans. 30% of income is charged, but no income is needed.

Short term residential care (up to 2 months at a time) for teens (age 13-17) who are unable to live in parental homes. Teens need referral from Dane Co. Department of Human Services Social Worker or Juvenile Court.

Porchlight, Inc.

- Safe Haven: for people with persistent mental illness
- Sober Living: for people in recovery from AODA*, 1mo.-1yr. sobriety required
- STABLE: for women with mental health issues

Holly House

Transitional Housing Program for single women who have addressed or be in treatment for any AODA or mental health (at least 2-3 months sober). Program fees between \$245-305/mo, must have a referral from a homeless service agency.

Women in Transition

10-bed house for women with mental illness who are on SSI/SSDI. Women must be sober. Transitions to permanent housing.

Hope Haven

425 W. Johnson St.

30-45 day living arrangement for adult men and women in need of 24 hour supervision due to AODA*. Fees are charged based on sliding scale.

Colvin Manor

425 W. Johnson St., 608-251-1849

Transitional living for sober individuals who have completed a residential treatment program for AODA*. Fees are charged based on a sliding scale.

Tellurian

300 Femrite Drive, Monona

- Acewood House (608-221-8443) and Crawford House (608-277-8768): Group homes for single individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. Referrals should be directed to CHARM (608-663-2120).
- Transitional Housing Program (608-222-7311, ext. 215): For homeless individuals with mental illness and/or chemical dependence. Goal is to transition people to permanent housing. Some fees are charged.
- Tellurian Permanent Housing Program (608-222-7311, ext. 224): For homeless individuals who have severe and persistent mental illness. Fees are 30% of adjusted income.
- McGovern Treatment Center (608-222-7311): Treatment facility for individuals with substance abuse problems needing residential treatment. Fees charged; some Dane County funding available for people without resources.

Housing Initiatives

Permanent community based housing for homeless people with severe mental illness who are unable to live on their own without supportive services. Must have referral from case manager. Waiting list is long.

Subsidized Housing

Some housing is available to people who have minor children, who are disabled or who are over the age of 62. Contact the HHD with questions or for applications (608-242-7406).
