The Tenant Resource Center is a non-profit membership organization with a small staff that relies primarily on volunteers to provide housing counseling, mediation services and office assistance. The majority of the Tenant Resource Center's funding comes from Dane County and the Associated Students of Madison (University of Wisconsin), the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, with additional funding from the City of Madison and Community Shares of Wisconsin. The remainder of our funding comes from memberships, donations, workshops and publication sales.

- Provides low-cost and free mediation services to people with housing-related disputes
